## 3 Days In The Grave, which 3 days?

you have to think the way a Jewish Believer does. In Jewish thinking a 24 hour day begins at sunset, not midnight. It's just like Genesis 1:5 which goes in the order of evening first \& then morning. The rule of interpretation is that scripture explains scripture. Jesus died at the end of 'Friday' \& was buried before Shabbot (Saturday) began (which in Gentile way of thinking is Friday night, but in Jewish way of thinking is the beginning of the Sabboth/Shabbot. The $3^{\text {rd }}$ day started at sunset on Saturday, which in J ewish thinking is the beginning of the first day of the week.

In Jewish thinking
Friday began at sunset on Thursday \& ended at the following sunset. Saturday began at sunset on Friday \& ended at the following sunset. Sunday began at sunset on Saturday \& ended at the following sunset. That makes 3 consecutive days that Messiah was in the grave. In that particular year, those days happened to be Friday, Saturday, \& Sunday. He rose before daylight Sunday morning.

If the above doesn't make sense to you, try the following:
The Creator defined the boundaries of a 24 hour day, \& where it starts \& where it finishes in Genesis 1:5,8,13,19,23 \& 31.
Gen 1:5 [KJV] And the evening and the morning were the first day. Gen 1:8[KJV] And the evening and the morning were the second day. Gen 1:13 [KJV] And the evening and the morning were the third day. Gen 1:19 [KJV] And the evening and the morning were the fourth day. Gen 1:23 [KJV] And the evening and the morning were the fifth day. Gen 1:31 [KJV] And the evening and the morning were the sixth day.
Jesus says that each new day begins when the evening begins.
According to our Creator \& our Redeemer, Friday begins at sunset on Thursday \& ends at the following sunset. Saturday begin at sunset on Friday \& ends at the following sunset. Sunday [the first day of the week] begins at sunset on Saturday \& ends at the following sunset.
